The impact of socioeconomic disadvantage on learning is a process, not an event. In many cases, the impact starts before birth. Therefore, at Cornelius Vermuyden School we adopt a long term approach. Our curriculum and the building of cultural capital is one of the greatest levers for tackling educational disadvantage. It is about what we teach, how we teach it, and how we check if it has stuck and been understood by our pupils.

Our strategy focusses on:

• Addressing school culture & expectations

• Having robust assessment of pupil need

• Identifying impact of disadvantage on learning in the classroom

• Adopting a tiered approach (Teaching & Learning, Academic Intervention & Wider Approaches)
